St Mary's at the top of the London university medal table

Students and alumni from London universities won a total of 15 Olympic medals at London 2012. St Mary's University College was top of the table thanks to the outstanding performances by superstar alumnus Mo Farah, who won gold in both the 5,000 and 10,000 metres. He is joined on the medal table by Moe Sibhi who won bronze in the men's eight rowing at Eton Dorney.

There were a total of 15 Olympians associated with St Mary's, including alumni and current students. There were also 4 Paralympians with an association to St Mary's, including David Weir, who won an amazing 4 gold medals.

St Mary's students are amongst the most satisfied in the UK

According to the 2012 National Student Survey (NSS), students at St Mary's University College, Twickenham, are amongst the most satisfied in the country. The National Student Survey is conducted annually across all publicly funded Higher Education Institutions in the UK and asks final year undergraduate students to provide feedback on various aspects of their learning experience.

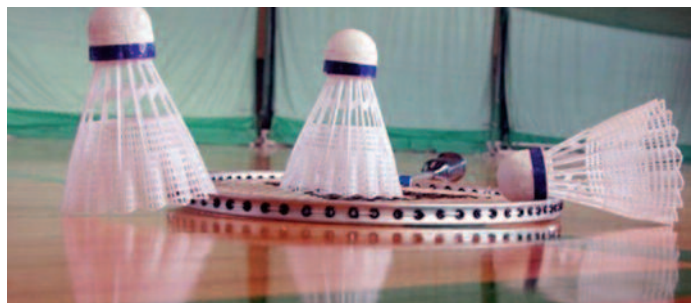
Out of the 122 institutions included in the survey the results showed that St Mary's students are highly satisfied with the quality of teaching, ranking the University College joint 15th.

The survey results also provided data for the recently published Sunday Times University Guide, which placed St Mary's sixth for students being most satisfied with the overall quality of their course. It also identified the University College as the fifth cheapest place to live as a student in the country.

St Mary's featured on Sky Sports News

A community badminton scheme which runs at St Mary's University College, Twickenham, was recently featured on Sky Sports News. The 'No Strings Badminton' scheme runs in conjunction with Badminton England and allows members of the public to play badminton at St Mary's for just £2 a session, offering the perfect opportunity for those new to the sport to begin playing.

Since the end of the London 2012 Olympic Games, the scheme has seen a



sharp increase in the number of people attending the twice weekly sessions, a trend that has been seen at similar sessions across the country.

In a piece that explored the increasing popularity of badminton and the impact of the Olympics on sport, Sky Sports News filmed a No Strings session and interviewed Sport St Mary's staff and players. St Mary's Sports Officer Tegan Pickles commented, "Since the Olympics, we have seen a big influx of people wanting to get back into sport, from those who have played before to complete beginners, and the No Strings Badminton sessions really cater for this."

Drama Graduates Win Theatre Prizes in South Korea

A cohort of MA Physical Theatre (International Ensemble) graduates from St Mary's University College, Twickenham, has won two South Korean theatre prizes after touring the country this summer. As part of the postgraduate programme, the students set up their own theatre company called Caketree, which aims to create imaginative theatrical experiences to engage and stimulate all ages by exploring various traditional and contemporary forms of theatre, dance and visual arts. The company devised two productions called *Across the Border* and *If Only*, which they performed previously in the UK at a number of venues including the Battersea Arts Centre in Clapham.

Following on from this success, Caketree was invited to tour South Korea, performing at the Koechang International Festival of Theatre and the Miryang Summer Arts Festival, where they were awarded the title of best play and best director.

Student Erica Mileham said, "We had a fantastic time and were overwhelmed by the welcome we got from the festivals. It was an amazing experience that we hope is just the beginning of our adventures in South Korea."

Kasia Zaremba Byrne, MA Physical Theatre (International Ensemble) Director at St Mary's said, "The MA Physical Theatre programme is designed to create theatre companies who tour internationally. This year's students have excelled as they also won prestigious awards. I am really proud of their achievement"

Mo Farah Visits St Mary's after Olympic Win



Double Olympic Gold medallist Mo Farah returned to his former training ground, St Mary's University College, Twickenham, last month for a coaching session on the athletics track.

The former student trained at St Mary's for nine years before moving to the USA 18 months ago. He regularly returns to the University College's Strawberry Hill campus to train when he is back in the UK, but this was his first visit since becoming a double Olympic Gold medallist three months ago.

He was greeted by students and staff who were keen to get a glimpse of him and, after signing autographs and taking pictures, set about training with fellow 10,000m Team GB athlete Chris Thompson, who accompanied him on the visit.

Fiji Rugby Team Trains at St Mary's



Players from the Fiji Rugby Union Team recently spent the day training at St Mary's University College, Twickenham, in preparation for the match against England. On Saturday, 10th November, Fiji took on England in the QBE Internationals tournament at nearby Twickenham stadium. Ahead of the game, the team based themselves at St Mary's where they took part in gym and outdoor training sessions on the rugby pitch.

St Mary's Director of Sport Andrew Reid-Smith commented, "We were delighted to have the Fiji team

training at St Mary's, they are an exciting side and our students and staff were really keen to watch them train. The University College offers world-class facilities for national teams preparing to play against England."

St Mary's regularly hosts international sports teams and athletes at its Strawberry Hill campus, including the England 7s rugby team and Paralympic champion David Weir. Fiji went on to lose the match 54-12.

Pat McQuaid Presents Olympic Gold Medal to Bradley Wiggins

St Mary's Alumnus, Pat McQuaid (1969-71), had the honour of presenting Bradley Wiggins with his gold and record seventh Olympic medal at Hampton Court Palace. Pat McQuaid has been the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI) president since 2006.



Law Programme Launched at St Mary's

St Mary's University College, Twickenham, has expanded its undergraduate course offering after launching a new Law (LLB) degree. The first cohort of students has now enrolled on the three year course for the 2012/13 academic year, building on the success of St Mary's existing BA (Hons) in Business Law, which began in 2006. The launch of the new LLB course means that, as one of three distinctively Catholic University Colleges in the UK, St Mary's is the first to have a single honours qualifying Law degree.

As part of the new course, the University College will be investing almost £300,000 in the provision of a new Law library, with core acquisition of both electronic and hard copy law publications.

There will be a strong focus on work experience, with St Mary's Career Service continuing to establish links with local employers to enable students to gain placements with solicitors, barristers and legal advice providers. If any alumni would be able to assist in helping us provide valuable work experience for these students we would like to hear from you.

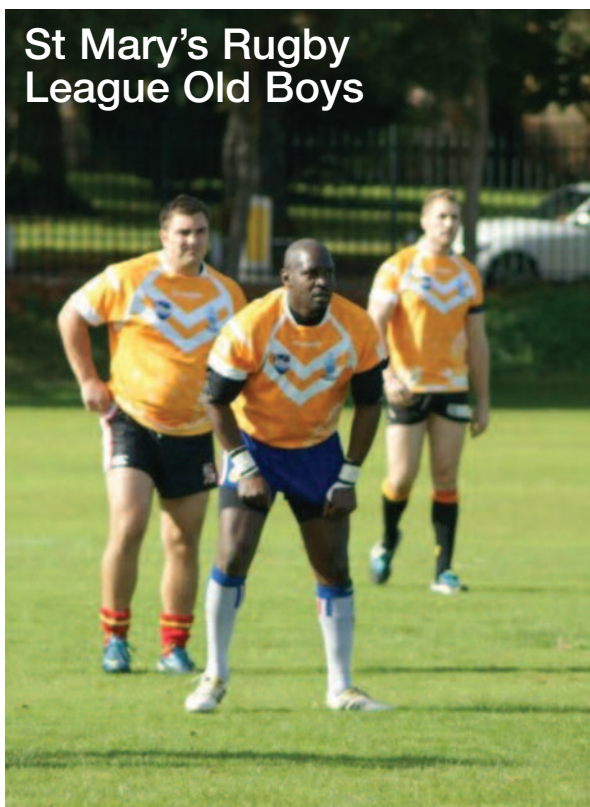
The University College also plans to develop a free legal advice clinic. Working with local legal firms, in the future, students on the course will be able to gain experience providing free legal advice to the local community.

St Mary's Deputy Principal Prof Janine Griffiths-Baker commented, "I am delighted that we have been able to expand our existing student offering with this new Law course. We have already made significant investment with a new library provision and work experience projects, and are also looking to double our current staff base over the next three years."

St Mary's Programme Director Christopher Hull added, "St Mary's provides a Law degree that is intellectually challenging and vocationally relevant within a vibrant and supportive academic community in which students can flourish, acquire a sense of vocation and professionalism, and graduate with the ability to use their skills and knowledge to contribute to the betterment of society as successful, conscientious professionals."

SIMMS RL VS OLD BOYS HT: 18-16 FT: 28-32

On a day filled with nostalgia and mirth, it was St Mary's that were left rueing their missed conversions in one of the closest Old Boys games to date. Had St Mary's had all their regular team at their disposal, this score line could have been very different.

With the Old Boys winning the wrestling match to decide kick off, thanks to an impressive display of ground skills from Michael "Roadkill" Bennett, spirits were high from the old men in yellow. This merriment was dramatically cut short when vice-captain Robbie Marr was rushed to hospital with a broken collarbone, ironically he was tackled by one of the Old Boys who had moved over to help numbers.

The Old Boys' dreadful start continued when James Szymik scored the first try for St Mary's, using his pace on the wing to exploit the under-prepared and under-trained Old Boys.

Realizing that this was not going to be a simple turnover, the Old Boys began to fight back with Szymik making up for his earlier indiscretion and scoring for the Old Boys before Jamie Macrae zipped over the line, pulling up with injury as he did so.

Both teams traded tries after that with the Old Boys appearing the most dominant, big centre Michael "MD" Darren showing why he was once a 1st team regular, bursting through 4 tacklers to touch down before St Mary's responded with fine displays from Alex Linton and Josh LC to send the current squad in leading 18-16 at the half.

A never say die attitude is something that has always been apparent among the St Mary's ethos, and none more so than within the Old Boys' division which was very evident, as well as the help of the half-time samosas courtesy of Naz, as a rejuvenated team hit the pitch. Within minutes the Old Boys had begun to take a commanding lead of the game, with Wayne "Mc BFG" Parillon smashing his way through the youthful defense to regain the lead for the Old Boys before Adam Barley managed to step his way through the defense, setting the ball up for Tom Sadler to sprint the remaining distance.

The greatest try was yet to come though and fittingly it came from the oldest of the Old Boys with Marc "Blade" Simon breaking through a tackle on the Old Boys' own 20 metre line and proceeding to gallop down the entire length of the pitch to thunderous applause from the crowd.

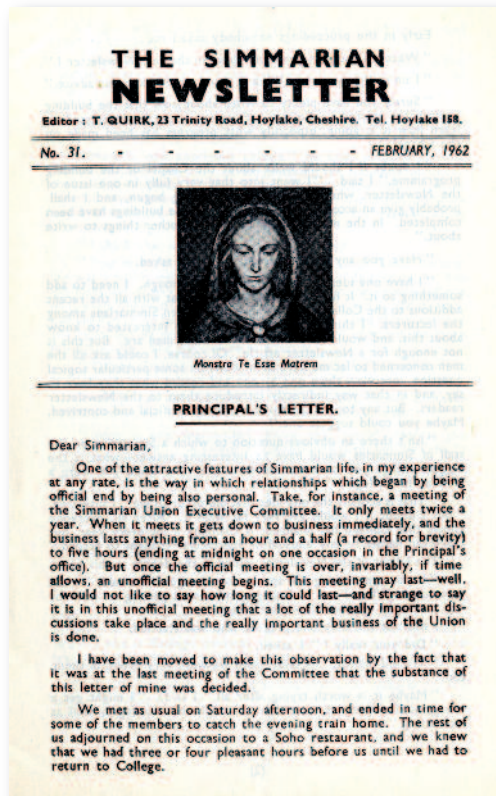
With a 14 point lead in place and 5 minutes left on the clock, the Old Boys began to loosen their grip on the game giving the 1st team a chance to restore their pride. Two quick tries in the last 5 minutes, including a very impressive solo effort from Ryan Ellis, left the Old Boys with their hearts in their mouths but, in the end, it was not enough as the Old Boys rode out the end to win for their fourth successive year.

We now have around 4000 students!

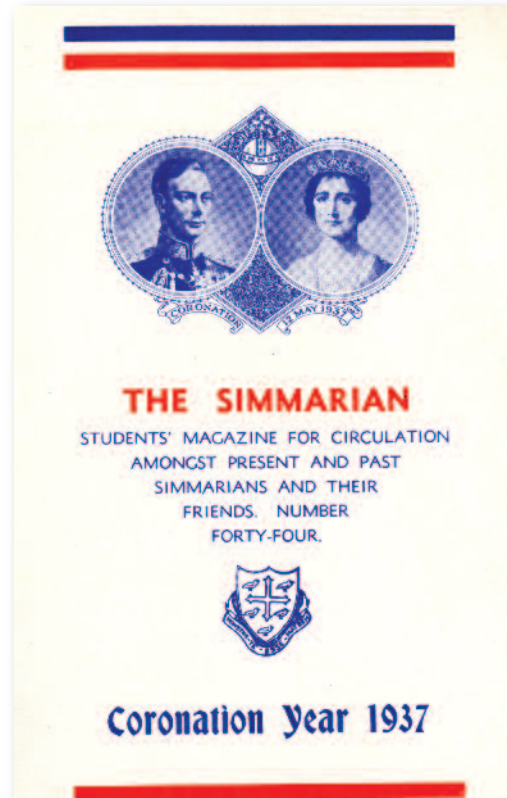


The Library and Chapel under construction in 1962.



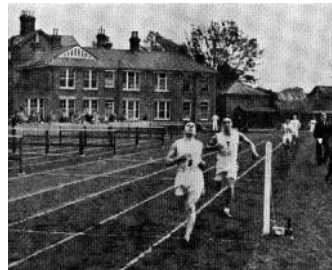
How they look in 2012.

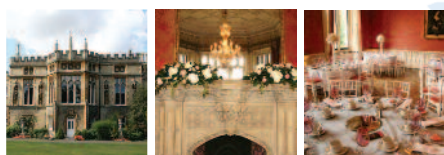

Choose Postgraduate Study at St Mary's University College
