### **About St Mary's** University

We are a small London campus university. focusing on quality rather than quantity. We provide a great experience for our students, with excellent teaching and outstanding support - the Times Good University Guide 2023 placed St Mary's in the top ten universities nationally, and top two in London, for both teaching quality and student experience. Our small size and our diverse, vibrant campus give St Mary's a wonderful community atmosphere. We pride ourselves on the excellent career prospects of our students, with 98% of graduates in employment, vocation and/or further study 15 months after graduating.


Established in 1850 and with a deep heritage in education, St Mary's has a strong reputation for teaching excellence and a student-centred approach. We continued our outstanding performance in the 2024 National Student Survey (NSS) which surveys graduating

students, ranking in the top five nationally for Learning Opportunities, Academic Support, and Organisation and Management, and top ten for Student Voice.

We also celebrated excellent TEF outcomes in September 2023, with a Gold for Student Experience and Silver for Student Outcomes and an 'Outstanding' Ofsted inspection in July 2024.

The main campus is on Waldegrave Road in Twickenham within the grounds of Strawberry Hill House. It is one of Britain's finest examples of Gothic revival architecture, built by Horace Walpole in 1747, and is accompanied by many heritage sites along the local stretch of the Thames. St Mary's has strong collaborative partnerships with many historical and cultural organisations in Richmond and Twickenham our Humanities and Liberal Arts students visit these and often work with them too.

On campus, we have halls of residence, many learning and study spaces, a refectory and cafe. and a commuter lounge. Our sports provision is impressive, with an Olympic-size running track, sports pitches and fields on our main campus and Teddington Lock.

The University has a long tradition of widening access to education, fostering a respectful and inclusive environment where all backgrounds are celebrated. Our Access and Participation Plan, which is approved and monitored by our regulator, the Office for Students, sets out our targets and commitments for reducing and eliminating any existing inequalities and addressing barriers that might prevent anyone from achieving their potential.

### About the Access to HE Diploma

The Diploma prepares adults (aged 19 and over) who do not necessarily have the qualifications required to enter university. Studying for an Access to HE qualification offers a solid introduction to key areas of subject knowledge and a broad range of study skills required to study at university level.

To gain the Diploma students must achieve 60 credits overall. 45 credits are made up of subject specific units at Level 3 and these units can



be achieved at Pass. Merit or Distinction. The remaining 15 credits are made up of study skills ungraded units at Level 2 or Level 3. The study skills units must be achieved to gain the Diploma.

All applications to study a degree at university are made through UCAS, UCAS provides a Tariff system to accurately compare different qualifications. An Access to HE Diploma with 45 graded credits achieved at a Pass is 48 Tariff points (equivalent to EEE at A level) and a Distinction is 144 Tariff points (equivalent to AAA at A level).

You include all units on your UCAS application so we can see the full range of your experience.

Non-native speakers of English must achieve a score of either 6.0 overall or not less than 5.5 in any section of the IELTS test of English language proficiency (or equivalent).

### **Open Days and Experience Days**

We run events throughout the year so you can see if St Mary's is for you. Our Open Days take place between June and November when you're considering where to apply. Experience Days are run between February and April, and are designed for those who have applied to study at St Mary's, to get hands-on experience of life on campus.

Open days and experience days are structured slightly differently from each other. However, both provide a chance to explore the University campus, meet current students and academics, and gain a greater insight into student life.

All open events consist of information sessions, academic subject talks, and campus and accommodation tours.

All of our Faculties and Schools are involved in our open days and experience days, with taster activities, subject talks and demonstrations.

### Starting at St Mary's **Academic Study** Support

We recognise that you may have been out of academic study for some time or are just not confident in your academic skills. All of our students, including Access to HE students, can have academic skills support at St Mary's. This is delivered online by the Library and the Learning Development Lecturers, and English Language support is provided by English for Academic Purposes tutors. The Learning Development Lecturers (LDLs) offer support drop-in clinics and can also work with your programme lecturers to set up support. They may be able to set up study skills for groups of Access students. Please ask your lecturers

or tutors in the first place as they can help you find the support you need. Find out more about support available.

You will also be supported by Pastoral Tutors who will help you succeed in day to day life at the University, as well as English for Academic Purposes tutors and Pastoral Tutors all who work together to support you during your time at St Mary's.

### **Our Commuter Lounge**

For students who do not live on campus, we have our lovely, homely Commuter Lounge with comfy sofas and tables to sit at to work, eat or chat. The Lounge has microwaves to heat meals with complimentary refreshments. There are also lockers to store books, equipment or sports gear during the day so you can join sports clubs and other activities. Find out more about our support for commuting students.

### Widening Participation


