How we'll support you at St Mary's

Offering advice, guidance and pastoral care to all students at St Mary's

The Student Services Department operates a range of frontline support services for students. They provide advice, guidance and pastoral care through the Accommodation Service, the Student Funding Service, and the Wellbeing Service.

Our friendly Student Services teams are on campus today to answer any questions that you might have before joining this September, make sure to say hello!

Accommodation Service

The Accommodation Service is here to provide guidance to students, whether you decide to live in university accommodation or privately managed halls. The team also help students who are house hunting and run several advice sessions, talks and a House Hunting Fair each year.

Below are some figures about how much accommodation costs at St Mary's. If you decide to live at St Mary's, it's important to remember that your **meals are included in your rent!** As you'll hear on your campus and accommodation tours today, you can use the SimmPay Cashless Rewards system to claim breakfast, lunch and dinner in the Refectory.

Fees relate to a specific academic year and are subject to change. For the 2026/27 academic year, the license start date was Sunday 13 September 2026 and ends Sunday 23 May 2027, a total of 36 weeks.

We guarantee a place in university accommodation to all new, first year, eligible undergraduate applicants. Eligible applicants will make St Mary's their firm choice on UCAS and will have applied by early June (specific date to be confirmed by the Accommodation Team in the new academic year). If you meet the criteria, you will be invited to apply automatically when you've made us your firm choice.

Student Funding Service and Lifelong Learning Entitlement (LLE)

The Student Funding Service offers advice and guidance on all aspects of student funding, including St Mary's Hardship Fund, budgeting and money management, cost of living support, student bank accounts, as well as support for Care Leavers, Care Experienced and Estranged students.

The team can also support you in applying for the LLE and discuss other ways which you can finance your studies. LLE is the new student finance system in England, and we've provided some more information on this below.

Tuition Fee Loan	Maintenance Fee Loan
Covers the full cost of your tuition fees.	Contributes towards living costs (rent, food, books, travel).
Paid directly to the university by the Government – you don't receive this money.	Paid directly into your bank account.
You could be eligible for up to £39,160 in Tuition Fee Loans, equivalent to around four years of full-time study. This can be used for a full course, short course, or credit-based modules. A full-time bachelor's degree is usually 120 credits per year, and you may be able to get additional funding for longer courses.	The amount you receive is based on your household income, the number of credits you study, where you'll be living during your studies (at home or away), and where you study (in or outside of London).

Any student loans you borrow need to be paid back, but not until you've finished or left your course and you're earning over £25,000 a year.

Your remaining loans will be written off 40 years after the April you're first due to pay.

You'll be charged 3.2% interest from the day the first loan payment is made to you or your university and until your loans are repaid in full or written off.

Student Finance applications will open in March 2027 and we advise you to apply as soon as possible. You can amend your application at any stage. To check your eligibility, head to www.gov.uk/student-finance.

St Mary's Family Discount

The St Mary's University Family Discount offers students who have a close relative connected to St Mary's a 10% tuition fee reduction for every year of their course. A close relative is defined as parent, child, sibling or spouse.

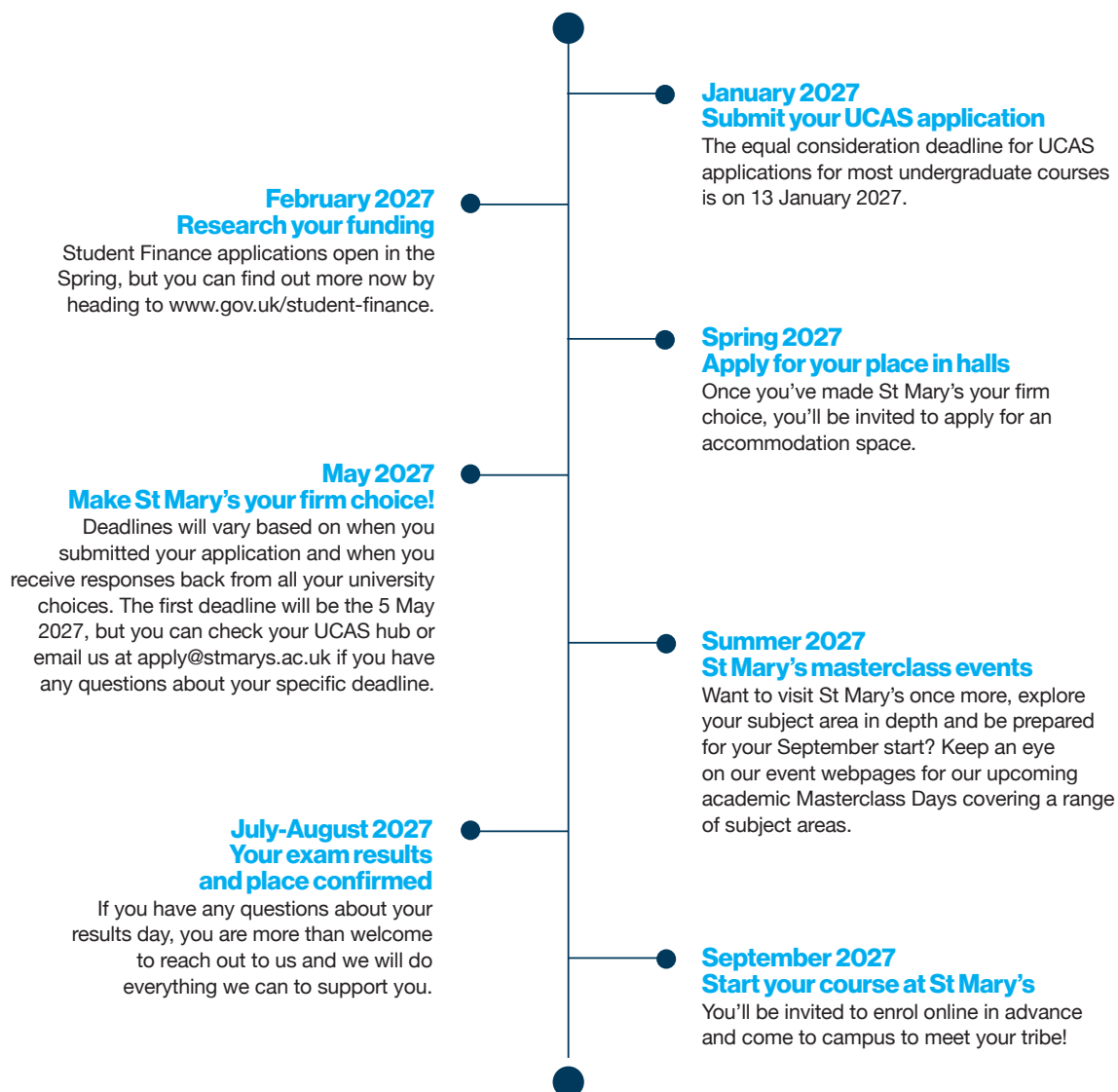

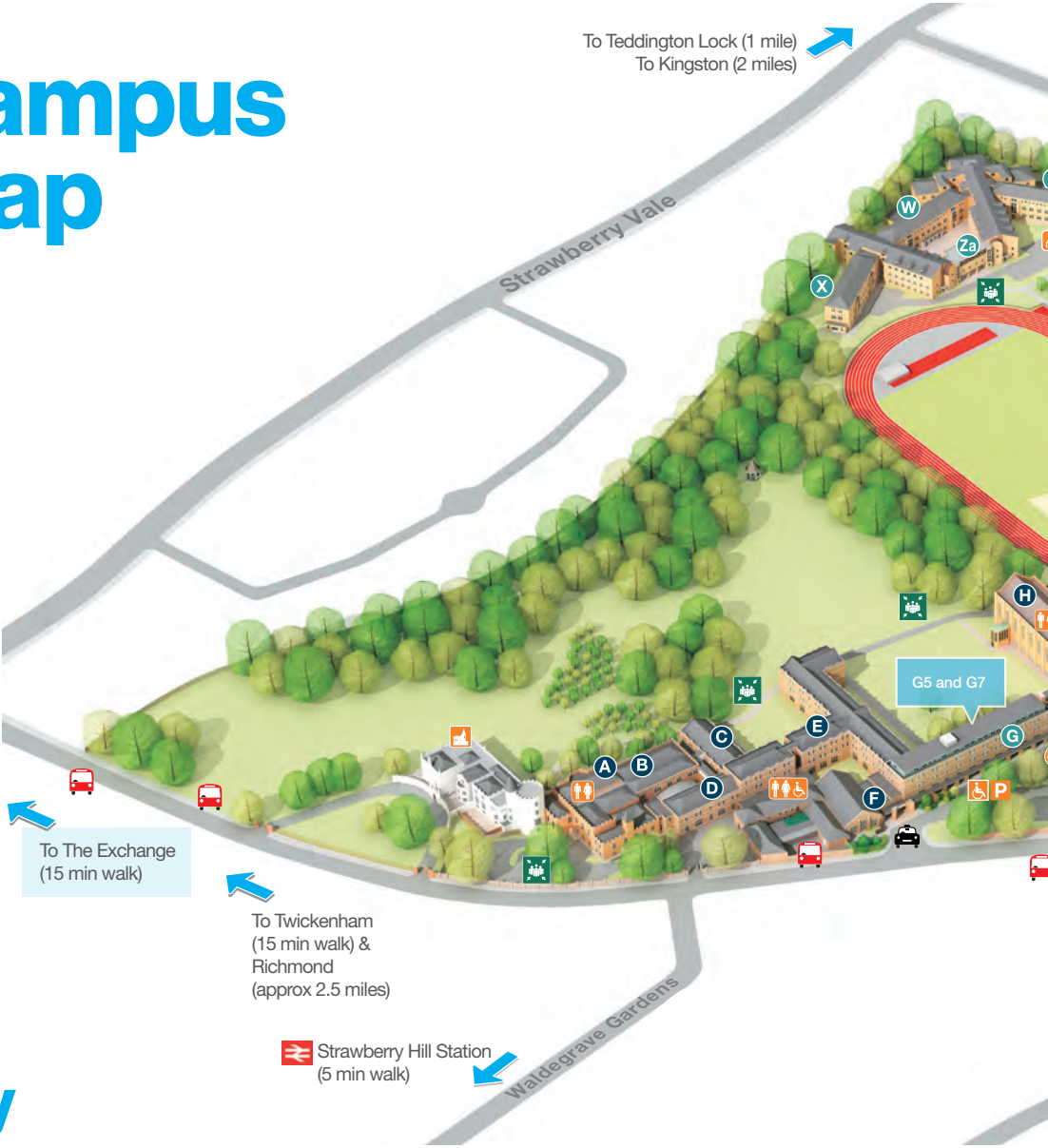
