Events



Explore the local area

If you have some free time after your visit today, why not make the most out of your trip to this beautiful part of London.

Twickenham may be most well-known for its association with rugby but there is plenty more to see, such as Church Street with its boutiques, cafés and bars. There are also sites of cultural and historical interest, including Hampton Court Palace, the Thames riverside and the nearby Royal Parks (Bushy and Richmond).

If you still have energy to spare, you can hop on a train from Twickenham and connect to Richmond, Clapham Junction and Waterloo.









My favourite place to go is Pools on the Park in Richmond. With a subscription I can swim whenever I like! You can catch the 490 bus from Twickenham which drops you off right outside the centre. It's incredibly easy to access and my friends and I enjoy swimming there. It's a great way to socialise and relax whilst exercising. On our way back from swimming, we usually stop off for bubble tea at Cupps on Kings Street which is just a short bus journey from the University. The people there are really friendly and always remember us when we come in. They offer student discounts and loyalty points if you get the app, which allows free drinks, so it's great for a student's budget!"


What do our students recommend?



Richmond is one of my favourite places in London and it's just a ten minute bus or train ride away from campus. The area by the Thames is beautiful, especially during sunset when you walk across the bridge or along the different trails. Church Street, in the heart of Twickenham, is a great spot with cafés, restaurants and boutiques. One of my all-time favourite restaurants is Osteria Pulcinella, an Italian gem where I had the most delicious food during my own Experience Day visit. I've made it a tradition to return for birthdays and special occasions! Let's not forget the Princess Alice charity shops – I adore thrifting there. The items found in the charity shops in this area are always of great value. There is the Rotunda in Kingston.
