This is an excerpt of Sam's closing speech from the IWD event.

Before we can embrace equity, we have to recognise where our own privilege exists – privileges not all other women have.

We have to recognise when others have experienced greater challenges than we have, even though we ourselves have experienced challenges.

We have to recognise and seize opportunities to use our privilege to champion and advocate for those who do not have that same privilege.

We have to be active allies.

On International Women's Day, we come together to celebrate and share the triumphs and challenges of our shared experience – that of being a woman.

It's not just about supporting and uplifting other women, it's about being intentional about how we uplift one another, and how often, and whom we choose to uplift. It is with this understanding that we can start to embrace equity.

And when I say embrace, what I really mean is, try.

When we try to understand and embrace equity, we know we will make mistakes, but we will own them and try again. So I am asking you right now to try, and to keep trying.

When we embrace equity, we seek to be here for each other as women, but also as women with different intersecting identities who need different things to achieve the same aim – equal opportunity for success.

We all deserve that opportunity, and it's up to each of us to help support each other in receiving it.

So thank you for joining us today, tomorrow, and every day of the year, as we embrace equity, and keep trying, together.

Because we don't all come from a level playing field.
