Maths and ECT opportunities



The LSW Maths Hub is offering a Specialist Knowledge for Teaching Mathematics for Primary Early Career Teachers. This project is designed to support primary early career teachers (teachers in their first two years of teaching) in developing specialist knowledge for teaching mathematics, thus enabling them to understand, teach and support pupils in maths in the classroom.

Participants will work deeply on one area of maths, drawing in the associated pedagogy, and activities will include lesson analysis and lesson design. This programme will take place across the equivalent of four days. The SKTM Primary Early Career Teachers Programme project is fully funded by the Maths Hubs Programme so is free to state funded participating schools. This workgroup will be led for the LSW Maths Hub by Nicola Tierney from St Mary's University and Lorraine Hartley from Roehampton University.
