Quorum: 6 attendees, including Chair or Deputy Chair. At least one ethics representative must be present from the Faulty/Institute of any applications to be reviewed. Memberships will be reviewed after a term of 3 years.

Terms of Reference

- 1. To promote ethical behaviour in all aspects of the University research.
- 2. To facilitate research activities while protecting the University and individuals from possible harm, and protecting the rights of individuals.
- 3. To consider and approve specific representations and research projects as required. *
- 4. To consider and approve specific representations relating to teaching as required.
- 5. To regularly audit ethics applications below level 3 for consistency.
- 6. To advise on the development of policy and procedures in relation to ethical issues in respect of research and teaching.
- 7. To consider any other matters referred to the Sub-Committee.

Delegated Authority from Academic Board, Subject to Reporting

- 1. To ensure accessibility and awareness of the University policy and procedures on ethics for staff and students.
- 2. To consider research proposals involving human participants and human data as outlined in Term 3.
- 3. To make the appropriate recommendations and approvals on specific representations and research projects as required.
