Background:

SIMMSport is a fun, high quality sports programme that delivers weekly coaching sessions to over 800 boys and girls aged 5 to 15 years every week, using Sport St. Mary's facilities.

Through our partnership with the Harlequin Amateurs Rugby Club, SIMMSQuins delivers rugby coaching to over 300 junior rugby players every week. Although each age group has a parent-coach that supports the delivery of the coaching sessions, we are looking for students who are proactive, energetic and enthusiastic to lead coaching sessions within the programme.

If you are an enthusiastic team player, enjoy working with children, are passionate about coaching and are looking for an extremely rewarding job then we want to hear from you!

Main Duties

1. To be an ambassador for SIMMSport, positively promoting the programme and encouraging participation

2. Create and deliver session plans that fit into the Head Coaches' termly coaching plans. All sessions should be fun, challenging and enjoyable for participants
3. Responsible for the safety of all participants including ensuring the safe use of equipment
4. To set up all equipment and activity areas
5. Ensure the facilities are treated with care and left tidy at the end of each session.
6. To be a positive role model
7. Communicate effectively with the Sports Workforce & Placements Officer and Harlequin Amateurs Rugby Club, informing them of any problems, concerns, accidents and incidents relating to any aspect of the role.
