# SMU ranked first in London for Academic Support









Earlier this month saw the release of the National Student Survey results and we're proud to announce that SMU has continued its outstanding performance in 2024.

The NSS, which surveys graduating students on their university experience, found that;

- SMU had improved across all seven of the key themes
- Ranking in the top five nationally\* for Learning Opportunities, Academic Support, and Organisation and Management and top ten for Teaching on My Course, and Student Voice, and,
- Ranked first in London for Academic Support and Organisation and management, and top five in four other categories.
- students rated the University 96% for how good are teaching staff at explaining things,
- 92% for both how easy was it to contact teaching staff when you needed to? and how well have teaching staff supported your learning?
- 91% for how well does your course introduce subjects and skills in a way that builds on what you have already learned? and,
- 90% I was given opportunities to meet my required practice learning outcomes.

Whilst you have been away over summer, there has been lots of work taking place on Campus, and we wanted to give you a preview!

<u>Student Heart Phase 2</u> has been making considerable progress. Function rooms have been added to the structure now, meaning that it is nearly ready to be able to hold a wide range of events on your return to campus.

Drama Studio 3 is being converted into a Gaming and E-Sports suite, which will enable Computer Science students to be able to embark on new projects and pieces of work, as well the inclusion of an impressive new 4.8 x 2 metre screen.

This was a student led project, as part of their work placement module, and it was presented to staff back in February 2024. #### Sport St Mary's Annual Round-Up



The 2024/25 academic year saw nearly 600 Sport St Mary's students participate in competitive sports, playing over 370 fixtures.

Highlights included five BUCS league wins, with men's futsal 1s promoted to the premiership and women's futsal topping their league.

Women's futsal president Charlotte Close ranked in the top three goal scorers nationally, the only female in the top five.

Nine students represented English Universities in regional or national squads across five sports, and seven BUCS medals were won, including four golds.

Beyond competition, £1,250 was spent on coaching qualifications for six students, and 38 students held paid roles. The SIMMSactive program engaged 188 students in physical activity, and sports clubs raised £17,199.13 for charity.

Sport St Mary's also hosted the first-ever university Wheelchair Rugby League session and secured a Varsity trophy at Brunel.

This summer, the facilities will host team Australia for their Olympic preparations, offering students valuable experience. We eagerly anticipate another successful year ahead.
